Q If you could ask one person (dead or alive) a specific question, who would it be and what?


A My Dad about his years in the Second World War that we never asked him about, he was in the Navy.

An interview with Will Cliff

AS A PROFESSIONAL ATHLETE, YOU ARE ALWAYS LOOKING TO WIN.

In each edition we focus on Elite Sports professionals and how we can help them.

We'll be interviewing sports professionals, at the top of their game, to find out more about life as an elite sports player.

At Franklyn, it's all about our clients and we want to get to know them, inside and out. With Franklyn Elite Sports, our clients are famous sports professionals and that's exactly what we do. We get to know them and now you can too.

So what exactly is Franklyn Elite sports? We caught up with Rugby union star Will Cliff who heads up Franklyn Elite Sports to give us the low down on exactly what he does, how he helps sports professionals and also a few more personal questions about the man himself.

Q&A

Q What is Franklyn Elite Sports?

A How long have you got? In a nutshell, Franklyn Elite Sports provides sport professionals with bespoke financial advice and a network which aims to maximise their career earnings.

Q Will, why did you join Franklyn?

A The first thing I thought of was the number of times I've been out drinking with Andy.

Well, I've known Andy and the team for around six years now, they started working on my own personal finances, they were brilliant, the most caring people I'd come across and they really wanted the best for me. They're a really close knit team that I feel really grateful to be a part of, everyone enjoys what they do.

Q Are there any similarities between being a financial adviser and being an elite sports professional?

A I'm not a financial adviser but Franklyn are very much a team, and that's where the comparisons are. The advisers and the office support team, all have to work hard, together, in order for the whole organisation to be a success.

It's like all businesses, if you want to be brilliant, if you want to be the best around, the best in the world, at whatever your profession is, it all comes down to hard work and the time that you put into it.

It's clear to see, with the amount of work that everyone puts in at Franklyn, that is where everyone wants to be and where they want to stay.



Q What will you miss the most about rugby when you join Franklyn full-time in July?

A I'll 100% miss the people the most, the lads, the environment in the changing rooms and around the Club. As well as that I'll miss the feeling of running out on the pitch, winning the game and finishing the game. You prep all week then there's no better feeling than walking off the pitch, with the lads, having won the game.

You are all in it together, running out in front of ten thousand people and then winning, that will be really hard to replace.

Now for a more personalised focus...

Q How would you describe yourself in five words?

A Probably best to get someone else to do this but I'd have to say....

Hard-working Motivated Fun Friendly Family-orientated

Q What has been the highlight of your career?

A That is a tough question, there have been so many. I'd have to say, a massive one was making my debut for Sale when I'd just turned 19.

Winning the Premiership Cup with Sale was also pretty special as we hadn't won anything in so long.

Also, the milestones for Sale, reaching 100 & 200 appearances, they were very proud moments. They played videos of my family and friends talking about me & my career, 200 was really special, even though we lost.

Q Who was your hero/favourite player when you were young?

A Jonny Wilkinson, same as most people.

He was just brilliant in the World Cup in 2003, then I played against him. They battered us by about 60 points but I got a photo with him after the game which made up for it.



Q What advice do you have for kids who want to be rugby players?

A First and foremost, you've got to enjoy it, go out and enjoy it with your mates. The rugby community shaped my life and the way I grew up, what I did, the habits I got into, the support network that you get is massive. I'm not sure about other sports but in rugby your support network is huge.

Enjoy it with your mates, whatever level it is, if it's something you really want, go after it!

You might not be the most skilful, the most physically blessed, but just work hard, practice more than anyone else, work harder than anyone else, get fitter than everyone else.

I was once told, if you're the best kicker in the squad, the best passer in the Club, if you're fitter than everyone else in your position then you're not going to be too far away.





Q Tell me the funniest rugby union story you know?

A I don't think I can tell you that! There's not many that are acceptable to be printed in a magazine at least...

Q What makes you smile and what scares you the most?

A Loads of things make me smile, I like smiling.
This question just made me smile! The kids
definitely make me smile the most, regardless
of what mood I'm in.

In terms of what scares me, that's a really hard question. I don't love flying, it makes me a bit anxious. I'm not scared of heights. I just like to be in control, if I was flying the plane it would be okay!

In fact, one thing that people don't know, which I don't necessary tell people, is in my second season for Sale, I got kneed in the face which broke my cheek bone, eye socket and I completely lost the sight in my left eye. Part of the bone had stabbed into my optic nerve.

I had to spend 3 months in hospital, I was told to retire, told by the doctors I wouldn't play again. I was 20 then, I'm 34 now, it took a lot of determination to then have a 14-year, full rugby career with limited vision.

I still don't have full vision in my left eye. So, if I damage my other eye, that would be really scary as I'd be pretty much blind.

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Q Tell us about your testimonial year?

As I've done 14 years at Sale and I'm retiring this year, I've been fortunate to have been offered a testimonial year as a thank you from the Club and the supporters.

We have a whole year of doing Cliffy's 9 events.

The first one is a testimonial game, it's a Legends game at Heywood Road in Sale, Sale's old ground. We have some pretty big names crawling out of the woodwork for it. It will be Sale Legends against Premiership All Stars; I can't wait for it.

Then we're going to do a Sale Sharks first team cricket match, we'll be doing some World Cup Supper Club events, a lady's night, a Gala dinner, some events for kids & family fun days in the community. Then we'll finish with a massive golf day.

The testimonial year will be supporting three charities who all do amazing work, The Sharks Foundation, The Joshua Tree and Restart.

The Sharks Foundation was a no brainer due to my links to the Club and the many initiatives they have that bring rugby and its values to under privileged and disabled children in the Manchester area.

The Joshua Tree is a children's cancer charity based in Northwich that I met through my work with Franklyn, these guys are amazing in the support they offer to the children but also the whole family around them.

Finally, Restart is the charity of the Rugby Players Association, they support players financially, physically and mentally that have to retire prematurely due to injury and 'restart their life.'

It will be a great year, loads of fun, raising loads of money and I'm hoping everyone will have a great time, as we'll be bringing the whole community together. Watch this space.

It's going from strength to strength and is now available in 150 venues, plus you can buy it online & there's an alcohol-free version.



An interview with Elisabeth Alexander

WOMEN IN BUSINESS

Lis is one of Franklyn's superstar advisers. If you're looking for a female perspective on things, she's the person to speak to.

We caught up with Lis in March this year, just after International Women's Day to quiz her about her success. A first class honours degree in Biomedical Science, a fantastic, high earning successful career, a loving marriage and all at the same time as raising her one year old son.

Q&A

- **Q** How long have you been at Franklyn?
- **A** I've been here for just over seven years now, incredibly.
- Q Tell us your story and how you came to be a financial adviser?
- A I certainly didn't leave University thinking I'd end up in Financial Services with my Biomedical Science degree. I had done a summer placement in the Global Research Lab for Smith & Nephew during University but realised my personality didn't suit a job in a laboratory. Instead, I spent my early

years after University trying to bring together the science with 'business' in some form. This culminated in various roles in top blue chip medical companies, such as Becton Dickinson and Johnson & Johnson as just two examples. I worked across sales and marketing in these businesses, thoroughly enjoyed them and did very well in that career over that initial eight years. While the time, particularly in Orthopaedics, was thoroughly enjoyable and I was well respected in my roles, I didn't feel fulfilled. I didn't have that sense that I was 'making a difference' and that mattered to me.

I have my husband to thank for my ultimate career change as it was he, who in our early relationship, introduced me to the concept of financial services and introduced me to his good friend, our Managing Partner, Andrew Chatterton. There was a dinner, much red wine and conversation about the industry, then I went back to my job... for two more years, before I decided I was brave enough to make the career change, learn a whole new industry and role and be a 'rookie' again at 31 years old!

Q Did you face any barriers as a woman working in financial services?

A For me, I don't think I saw anything as a barrier since entering this industry. I appreciate that over the years, it has been a male dominated industry, and percentages of women in the role are still far from 'balanced' however, I personally haven't faced any of that since joining the industry. If anything, I think women can often have many qualities which naturally lend themselves to being excellent as a wealth manager / financial adviser.

Q What's the best thing about being a financial adviser?

A Being able to pass on the advice and wisdom you've learnt over the years and see it make a noticeable difference to a person or family. There is nothing better.



Q How do you manage a busy working life at the same time as raising your son?

A Sometimes I don't! Haha. As any working parent will tell you it is a constant battle to keep the balance right and some weeks you are better at it than others.

I try to set clear boundaries in my week and I'm fortunate to be able to split my week between 'mummy' and 'wealth manager'. I make sure that in those times, my focus is purely on the people I am with. Both one year olds and clients demand and deserve your full attention and I ensure I am 'present' to do that. It is a wonder I haven't yet referenced a nursery rhyme in a client meeting, but I guess there is still time.

Q How do you deal with stress and maintain a healthy work-life balance?

A This is something I constantly work on, even before my son. I lost my dad when I was in my early 20s and it really did focus me on what was truly important and that is our health. Anyone who knows me will know that I am extremely self-motivated and often this can mean I lean into the 'work' side a little too much. Having my son, has reminded me of the importance of keeping this balance. I believe in continually learning and trying new activities, be it reformer pilates or swimming classes with my son for example; all of which help balance.

Q You're incredibility inspirational, tell us who has inspired you?

A That's extremely kind of you to say.

I have a whole host of people who have inspired me in different ways along the way from when I was very young. I am very fortunate to be surrounded by a close family, husband and very good friends, who are all inspirational to me in their own way. I even take inspiration from my one year old son who inspires me with his unwavering intrigue and smile.

Q What would you say is your personal definition of success?

For me it is having the freedom to live the life I want to live with my family. This to me is a happy and fulfilled life full of experiences and travel.

Q What's the best piece of advice you've ever been given?

A I vividly remember my Dad telling my younger brother and I that "no one is born a CEO". While it may seem a little silly,

and I don't necessarily want to be a CEO, I remember just thinking "Wow I could do anything" and my world of possibilities and ambition ran wild. I've never lost that ambition or intrigue to try new things and explore and I am immensely grateful for that advice.

Q What did you want to be when you were younger?

A Many, many things.

Q Is there anything you know now that you wish you had known earlier on in your career?

A That's a tough one. I don't think there is.
I think part of the fun of growing up and
developing in your career is you never know
what is to come and what new exciting
opportunity may present itself.

Q What would you tell a young woman starting out in her career?

A Be brave. I think we can too often focus on differences with being in business, as it were, as woman. I don't deny there are differences, and obstacles to overcome in certain industries. However, I think if you focus on just being absolutely great at what you do, gender will continue to become less and less relevant to that conversation.

Q Finally, what advice would you give to women who want to become top financial advisers?

A Be open to continual learning and be yourself. This industry is one of continual learning and development, whether that's through exams or indeed 'every day life' with clients and experiences. All of this only serves to make you better at what you do. You must be 'you' in all that you do, and bringing your life experience and personality to this job is so important. You have long term relationships with clients and this of course means you can support them throughout.

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AN INTERVIEW WITH ARMAND BEASLEY

CELEBRITY MAKE UP ARTIST, ACTOR & PRESENTER

We caught up with the wonderful beauty expert, Armand Beasley to talk makeup, summer styling and his Pro Body Glow Skin Balm.

Armand has been in the cosmetics industry since 1994, but first became a makeup artist in 1996 where he was UK National Makeup Artist for Givenchy. After extensive skincare, makeup and fragrance training with various cosmetic companies, he became Personal Beauty Advisor for House Of Fraser in 1998.

Since 2000, Armand has worked with some of the most beautiful men and women in the world on events ranging from the Oscars to the BAFTA's.

Armand, tell us a bit more about you and exactly what you do?

I started off as an actor but needed to supplement my income so I started working on the Clinique counter in Kendals, Manchester. I had no experience in cosmetics, it was literally a job between gigs but because I love people, the creative edge of makeup and learning about skin, I explored the beauty industry further. I was trained in various different cosmetic companies and then things really started to take off.

My big break was when Marie Claire magazine did a review of me, which was a really wonderful review, and it made me think perhaps I could do this as a potential career, alongside my acting. Granada TV needed someone to talk about beauty, so I took on that role in 1994 and it all started from there.



I then went on to be featured as on screen expert for GMTV and also This Morning, plus I have my own show called Fakeover, where I stop people in the street and do a makeup transformation on them. It was filmed back in 2010 but you can still catch some of the episodes on the Discovery Channel.

As an actor, I've just filmed a BBC drama, which airs later this year. Plus I am also an ambassador for the luxury, on demand hair and makeup app; Artiste.co.uk. They're a great company that send expert hair and makeup artists to glamorise you, wherever you may be.

I'm a great believer that everything happens for a reason and if something comes your way, take it. It could be something that really challenges you, but take it.

30 - 41 THE BEAUTY EDIT

It's been a very organic pathway for me, from the makeup, to the acting, to reiki and organic health and wellness.

It's not about just looking good, it's about feeling good and a person's exterior is a barometer of what is going on inside.

I always ask my clients in their consultation, "how are you feeling, tell me about you, what's going on in your life?" I give my clients the opportunity to vent and divulge how they are truly feeling inside and I can provide further support for them, if required, through my contacts.

Life is all about balance. I would always say to embrace your challenges and I try to help my clients do the same.

Exfoliate at least once a week. If you body brush, ensure you brush up towards the heart.


Nourish your skin and enhance your glow.


My Pro Body Glow is great in doing this and a little 'glows' a long way!

- 3. Invest in a really good cleanser. Cleaning your skin is vital. Make sure it's really clean by removing your makeup properly, using a reliable makeup remover, not face wipes. Follow with your favourite facial wash or cream cleanser.
- 4. Use a good serum. I use Bakuchiol oil, it's a plant based resin, which helps with cellular turnover so for people concerned with lines, it's a great investment, plus it's not sun sensitive.
- 5. Use an effective eye treatment. The eye area is 40% finer than the rest of the skin on your face. I love SKN-RG Eye Elixir serum. They're a British based brand who source a lot of their ingredients from the British Isles. All their products are either certified organic or natural.





Q How important is ethical & natural beauty?

A It's paramount for me. Society thinks that we are at the pinnacle of civilisation, but if we're not careful we could be on the verge of devolving rather than evolving.

It's important that we have a sense of connection with what we do, with what we eat, and what we put on our skin. We apply so many beauty products to our bodies but not many of us know exactly what is in them. Our skin is our largest organ and it needs to breathe. You excrete through the skin but you also absorb. Depending on the molecular structure of what you put on your skin, for example a nicotine patch, it can be absorbed into you body. If you put 25 products on your skin on a daily basis, some of those will potentially be absorbed into your system.

For me, ethical, sustainable and cruelty free products are very important. I'm not saying everyone should be vegan, I'm not vegan myself but when I eat fish, I try to get organic fish and I appreciate the food I eat.

When it comes to beauty, in this day & age, I'm a firm believer that no animal has to die for your lipstick.

It doesn't have to happen especially when you can test in so many different ways. However, in some countries, for example China, it's still mandatory to test on animals. Organisations such as Cruelty Free International & Peta are trying to change this.

In the EU, brands have to adhere to strict animal testing legislation, however the UK are trying to repeal some of the many EU legislations, one is animal testing, which will hopefully stay in place. If you feel strongly about this, let your MP know.

Q You're a very positive person, what's the key to staying positive?

A Knowing that this too shall pass. Nothing lasts forever. Breathe your way through your challenging times, take a few deep breaths and nothing is as bad as it first appears.

Even if it's the most traumatic experience that you could go through, remember your breath work and remember the moment will pass and there will be a new moment for you to embrace.

Tell us about your Pro Body Glow Skin Balm?

Pro Body Glow started as a conversation between Goldie Hawn and I. I was mixing a few products for her to get the desired look for her skin and I mentioned "wouldn't it be great if we just had one product" to which she replied, "honey, just design one" and that planted the seed in my head.

Q Do you have any daily rituals that you follow?

A I wake up and say how thankful I am for having a great night's sleep and think about what I'm grateful for. How you start the day sets the tone for the day, for how you feel. Then I stretch and get out of bed. In my head I have a song and I stretch and have a little move to the song.

I will also do a bit of meditation.

Connecting to where I'm at in that moment in time. It could be standing, looking out the window, connecting my bare feet to the earth and focusing on my breath. Only for a few minutes.

Or, if I'm going for a walk, it's observing everything around me. That's it, that's all mindfulness is. You don't have to sit on a rock and hum. It's about being in the moment.

Just focus on what you see, that might be a blade of grass, which is such a vivid shade of green. When you start to look at things and your attention goes there it's amazing how much you then start to notice.

Life is so fast paced, we're so eager to get to the destination, we don't always appreciate the journey.

The present is the greatest gift, that's why it's called the 'present' it's the only thing that exists, the moment.

I feel phones and technology are so intrusive, one thing I would suggest to everyone is to never have your phone in your bedroom.

The blue light frequency and low level radiation mean it's important to have a break from these devices.

Q What quote do you live by?

A It would have to be something about balance. I always try to have balance in my life. Nothing is ever extreme.



This time we caught up with Allan to get his top summer recipe. Here's the ingredients and method for you to try.

Your very own Á la Carte at home...

Miso glazed salmon rice noodles, Asian lime slaw, peanuts with edamame beans and peas

Ingredients:

- 4 tsp miso paste
- 2 tbsp fish sauce
- 4 x 130g salmon
- · 1 packet rice noodles
- 3 tbsp Shaoxing rice wine
- 2 tsp sesame oil
- 75g peanuts
- 100g peas
- 100g edamame beans
- · 1tsp coconut oil
- Cucumber
- Red Pepper
- Carrot
- Spring onions
- 1 lime
- Salt

Method:

Pre heat the oven to 180 °C

Mix the miso paste and fish sauce to loosen the paste.

Coat the salmon with the paste and marinate for 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, pour boiling water over the rice noodles and leave to soak for 3 minutes.

Once softened, drain and pour cold water over them to stop them cooking.

Add the wine vinegar, sesame oil and salt. Toss and check for seasoning.

Bake the salmon for 20 minutes.

Cut the cucumber, red pepper, spring onion and carrot into thin strips. (you can use as many vegetables as you like).

Add the lime juice, a touch of salt and leave for 10-15 minutes.

In a none stick frying pan, gently dry fry the peanuts until golden brown.

Next, add the coconut oil to the pan and gently fry the edamame beans and peas.

You are now ready to begin plating!

Begin with the noodles in the centre of the plate, add the salmon and arrange the nuts, peas and beans around the outside, top with lime slaw.

Q&A

Q Darren tell us about Happy Radio and why it was formed?

A So, I worked for the big blue-chip company Bauer media, for 25 years and they were expanding from local radio stations to build a national brand. At around this time, whenever I was out at events and DJing at gigs so many people asked me...

'What happened to local radio? What happened to Key 103? We miss it. where's Steve Penk these days? We miss the good old days.'

People continued to say it for a few years and that's when I realised there's a great opportunity here for a great sounding local radio station, with some heritage names.

Post Covid it felt like the right time. I got together with Max, my business partner, and we launched a local radio station, that not only sounded great, with some heritage names, giving that local feel back, but was seen out and about. We do outside broadcasts & we're involved in loads of events across the year.

That's how Happy Radio came about. It's a radio station, that makes you feel great, playing happy music with presenters having a great time.

Where can we listen to it?

We're on DAB all over Manchester & Cheshire. We're on the app, Happy Radio UK in the app store. You can get us online, on smart speakers, Alexa & Google and we're on TV, Freeview channel 277.

Q What kind of music do you play and what audiences are you appealing to?

A We play everything from 70's to current stuff and everything in-between. Our strapline is songs that make you smile.

> As long as it makes you smile, there's no rules. Our target is 35-64 but we appeal to all. Steve Penk does a rewind hour playing classic songs that we've not heard for ages.


Q Do you miss your days at Key 103 & Radio City?

A I miss the team, we had a great time. At Radio City we did some huge outdoor festivals with 1,000's of people. It was great fun. The business has changed a bit, now it's much more corporate.

Q Who's the most famous person you've interviewed?

A There's a few but Bono has to be the most memorable.

> I had a really good chat with him, about Michael Hutchence actually. It was just after he took his own life. They were really good friends. He told me he spoke to him on a daily basis. On the day he died, they didn't talk and he said if they had spoken, he could have saved his life. The U2 song 'Stuck in a Moment' was written about Michael Hutchence. It was a really emotional interview, he really opened up.



Also, I've interviewed Barry White. Plus, Britney Spears... I had just 15 minutes with her in California, and then got on a plane and flew back.

Q Who's the nicest person you've interviewed?

A It's got to be Robbie Williams, he's a great guy. We're both Stoke boys and have a mutual friend, Jonny Wilks in common so we really hit it off.

Also, Peter Kay was really great, he walked into the studio and said "I know you, I've seen your column in the Bolton Evening News!"

Q If you weren't a radio presenter and DJ what would you be?

A I'd probably be a van driver for Amazon! Something as glamorous as that.

Radio is the only thing I can do, I'm not very good at anything else, it scares me when I think about that. I really don't know, although I would probably make a good sales person. Radio presenters are great communicators, which would be a good skill for a sales role.










CELEBRATING185 YEARS





Our top Summer weekend escapes



Need to escape for the weekend? Here are our top three European summer weekend destinations.

Rome

If you're a culture vulture and don't mind a lot of walking on your weekends away then Rome is the perfect city break. Combine fantastic museums, Roman antiquities with fine restaurants & bustling bars.

See Michelangelo's famous painting in the Sistine Chapel; explore the boutiques, artisan workshops, and traditional restaurants in the medieval neighbourhood of Monti or head out of the Vatican's borders to check out the high-end shops and smart squares in Prati.

Discover an ancient world in the Eternal City of Rome. Walk the Spanish Steps, visit the gladiatorial arena of The Colosseum, a 2000-year-old temple known as The Pantheon; and the largest church in the world, St. Peter's Basilica.





Seville

Southern Spain's largest city, Seville, is famed for its flamenco and rich architectural legacy. Unmissable sites include the 15th-century Cathedral de Sevilla, the world's largest Gothic cathedral, and the Plaza de Espana, a vibrant square paved with intricate ceramic tiles and colourful fish!

For a typically Spanish setting, wander through the Old Jewish Quarter, the contrast of its scarlet geraniums against the whitewashed alleyways with the occasional horse and cart passing by make it the perfect photo-op for your album.

The Warren Beach, Abersoch
